

#### Establishment

The department was established in the year 1916 and was shifted to Manasagangotri campus in 1960. Since then, it has evolved over the years under the able guidance of different chairpersons. Today, it is one of the largest departments (in terms of student strength) on the campus with well-developed infrastructure facilities and offering diversified courses.

#### Admission

The department receives an average of 300 applications every year for admission into Post Graduation courses in Economics and Cooperative Management. While bachelor's degree with Economics as a major is the essential qualification for admission into M.A in Economics, M.A in Co-operative Management is open to all graduates. The department receives applications from students of Mysore University, and from other state Universities. Foreign students are recommended by the ICCR. The approved strength of the department is 46 students under Scheme A, 22 under Scheme B (Partially Self-Financing Scheme), 10 Foreign Nationals and 5 under other quota.

#### **Assessment Pattern**

Under the CBCS scheme, students are continuously assessed for their performance. The assessment pattern is divided into three components -- C1, C2 and C3. While 30% of the total marks is awarded by the faculty under internal assessment through C1 and C2 components, the students write the examination for 70% of the marks and this is assessed by both internal and external faculty. The tutorial component of the course comprises group discussions on contemporary issues, seminars and paper presentations by the students, field visits etc.
