

called the Department of Studies in Library and Information Science,
was started on 24th June 1965 with 20 students for Bachelor's Degree in Library
Science. Prof. P.K. Patil, who later served as the Director of Public Libraries in Karnataka,
collaborated with the stalwart Prof. K.S. Deshpande and laid the foundation for developing the Department.

The Department has led the library science education in Karnataka from the frontline by starting the Masters (1971), PhD (1976), and Integrated Masters (1992) programmes before other insitutions could do so. The metamorphosis from the Department of Library Science to the Department of Library and Information Science in the year 1976 changed the complexion of teaching in the discipline. The major focus was on information. Further, introducing a two-year integrated MLISc in 1992, in the place of a one-year BLISc and a one-year MLISc, was a bold decision that enhanced the intensity and quality of imparting education in the discipline.

The Department has had significant teaching and research contributions from former faculty members, including Prof. H.A. Khan, Sri. T.V. Subramanyam, Prof. B. Nagappa, Prof. K.S. Raghavan, Prof. N.B. Pangannaya, Prof. V.G. Talawar, Prof. Shalini R. Urs, Prof. B.S. Maheswarappa, Prof. Khaiser Jahan Begum, Prof. Y. Venkatesha and Smt. B.C. Indira.

The faculty and alumni of the Department have occupied much-coveted posts such as the Director General of National Library of India, and have been Vice-Chancellors and Professors at various universities. They have become Information Entrepreneurs, Head/Chief Librarians at central and state government libraries and important research institutes. Prof. V.G. Talawar served as the first Vice-Chancellor from the fileld of library and information science in India.

Vision: Be a leader in LIS education research landscape in Asia and always maintain and sustain our leader-ship position in India.







Research Projects

The e-thesis repository movement in India started at the Department with the launching of the Vidyanidhi Project with a munificent grant from the Ford Foundation and the Department of Science and Technology, Government of India under NISSAT Project. Prof. Shalini R. Urs's Project Vidyanidhi is the first-ever digital library initiative in the field in India. Vidyanidhi project developed a prototype for digitizing the thesis and developing a repository. The database had more than one lakh metadata records and ten thousand full-texts of theses. The project was terminated when the INFLIBNET started Shodhganga.

The Department was the first among the universities in Karnataka to be recognized as UGC-SAP department in Library and Information Science. The UGC supported the Department under SAP in two phases with 24 lakhs and 35.50 lakhs between 2017 and 2020. The Department's infrastructure and research profiles witnessed significant progress during this period.

The Department has established itself as a consulting resource for the libraries venturing in library automation and digital library projects.




Placement
