Profile of the Department

The Department of Philosophy is as old as the University.

It was established under the able stewardship of Prof. A.R. Wadia,

who had his higher education in Oxford University in 1916. He came

all the way from Mumbai to start the Department and preside over the fortunes

of it. Prof. Mysore Hiriyanna, widely known for his deep scholarship in Sanskrit taught Indian Philosophy at the Department. In 1918 Prof. S. Radhakrishnan, who later became the President of India, joined the staff of the Department and by his magnetic personality and unbound love, attracted thousands of students both from Science and Arts faculties.

Several learned teachers, like Professor K.R.Srinivasa Iyengar, Prof.G.Hanumantha Rao, Prof.T.A.Purushottam, Prof.M.Yamunacharya, Prof.H.N.Raghavendrachar, Prof.H.K.Raja Rao, Prof.C.V.Srinivasa Murthy, Prof.N.A.Nikkam, Prof.Mendonza, Prof.S.S.Raghavachar, Prof. H.T.Shantha have taught in the past and contributed a lot to the richness of the subject and the growth of the department. Prof.Brajendranath Seal and Prof.N.A.Nikkam became the Vice-Chancellor of the University of Mysore, Mysore. The Department also attracted talented litterateurs like Prof.K.V.Puttappa (Kuvempu), Prof.A.N.Murthy Rao, Prof.V.Sitaramaiah, Prof.S.L.Bhyrappa and many others. "The Indian Philosophical Congress (I.P.C.)", was founded by Sri Rabindranath Tagore and Prof.S.Radhakrishnan. Prof.S.Radhakrishnan who was the second Professor of Philosophy in the department, occupied the highest position in the country, the President of Indian Republic.

It's a matter of pride to the University as well as the department that His Highness Shri Jayachamarajendra Wodeyar, the Maharaja of Mysore was a student of Philosophy in BA honours and has secured Gold Medals in the subject.

To start with, the Department offered Philosophy B.A. (Hons.) and later introduced M.A. Course. The Department threw open its doors to students from all the subjects.

Till date, the Department has produced 100 Ph.D.s on various topics on Eastern and Western Philosophy, under the able guidance of various faculty members. The University instituted a "Chair in Vivekananda Studies" in 1996. Dr. Prabhushankara was the first Visiting Professor.

The Department also had the Privilege of visits by distinguished scholars from within and outside the country.
